
La classe de maternelle, Claire, Fanny, Mélina, Sara, Cristina et Barbara

We went for a walk in a park near the school in October to observe the signs of autumn and brought back chestnuts and leaves to school!






In November, we took part in "anti-bullying week" and talked about being a good friend. We wrote down our ideas on our "arbre des supers copains" ("the great friends tree").





















La classe de CE1, Tuesday, Manuelle and Cristina

Ingredients:

1 pizza dough rolled out

1 jar of tomato coulis

1 ball of mozzarella

Vegetables (peppers, tomatoes, mushrooms)

A few basil leaves

Olive oil, oregano, salt

Method:


- 1. Mix the tomato coulis with a little olive oil and oregano, add salt.
- 2. Spread the sauce on the dough
- 3. Sprinkle with pieces of mozzarella, peppers, mushrooms, olives. Add a few basil leaves.
- 4. Cook and enjoy hot.

to sign a box on the card. At the end of each completed line, children receive a star and add one on the class chart.





Workshops in CM classes

Since the beginning of the school year, the CM1/CM2 and CM2 classes on Fridays have a new organisation in the afternoon. Pupils from the 2 classes are mixed and divided into 4 groups for varied activities in small groups. They participate in 2 workshops per week. The program therefore changes once a fortnight. There is generally a games workshop (in reading or language study) with Barbara, a writing production workshop with Sarah or Manuelle, a literature workshop with Sarah or Manuelle, and an independent workshop with self-correcting exercises. Currently, 2 workshops are working on different aspects of reading aloud: making liaisons and reading expressively. The workshops are always eagerly awaited by children!


"Enfer d'école"

During Anti-bullying week, the 3 CM classes were invited to listen to the story of a bullying situation. The situation was described by the different protagonists: Randa, victim, Madame N'Moga her mother, Madame Senon, the class teacher, Angèle, the the bully and Fatima the bystander. Children were able to discuss each person's feelings, make hypothesis about the outcome of the story but also reflect on how bullying situations work and their own experiences. A very moving afternoon for pupils and adults alike.

During this first term, we learnt to know each other, and we discovered the vocabulary of the school. We also did some activities around Halloween, the Autumn season, and apples. We even made our own "Chaussons Aux Pommes" (apple turn over).















Classe GCSE, Saturday morning, Cyprien and Erwan

Well done to all our Saturday morning GCSE students for such a great start this year!

Lessons have included a mix of Listening, Reading, Speaking and Writing activities with a special attention given to verbs and grammar. Our teaching assistant, Erwan, is also with us, offering valuable support during lessons.

We are planning to cover all 12 GCSE topics this year to familiarise the students with the content of the course. Topics will then be revisited more in-depth next year.

Students who are thinking of entering for the GCSE soon are receiving more specific guidance in the form of past papers and parent-teacher conversations. Exam top-tips are shared with the class in each lesson.

Key highlights so far, include:

- Le magicien (mind-reader): a guess-my-sentence activity on the Unit 1 topic (Family and friends) to practice être and avoir.
- Excellent use of our irregular verb table by the students, who are showing resilience and determination at getting their verb conjugation right.

Great mini debate on the advantages and disadvantage

 Great mini-debate on the advantages and disadvantages of technology (Unit 2 topic).

• Fun and exciting game "one pen, one dice", where the aim, in pairs, is to win both for speed AND accuracy!

I'm Sarah and I am one of the Day Release teachers. I teach the GS, CP, CM1 and CM1/CM2 classes from Tuesday to Friday.



We would like to congratulate Sarah and her husband Ross who got married in November!


